Equinox, a science exhibition, was organised at school on 20th July 2024 to pique students' curiosity and cultivate an innovative and inventive mindset.

The theme for Grade 5 students was 'Organs and Organ Systems', where the students presented the working models of the organs and their functions in our body, which was a fantastic way for the students to understand the inner workings of the human body. By creating organ systems models, the students were able to understand the workings of the organs such as lungs, eyes, kidneys, heart, and so on. This hands-on approach enhanced their learning experience and developed a deeper understanding of the human body's intricate mechanisms.



The theme for Grade 6 was 'Space and Technology'. The students created the working models of how eclipses are formed, the solar system, black hole and the white hole and how they are formed in the space, satellites and how they function, orbital mechanisms. The students created rocket launches, which was amazing and flabbergasting to the spectators. By looking at the understanding and talent of the students, it seems the space travel isn't going to be a farfetched idea anymore and might be a possibility in the near future.



The theme for Grade 7 was 'Artificial Intelligence'. The students created the working models of toll gates, security around the buildings, spectacles to help blind people and various innovative and practical projects using Arduino boards and writing codes. 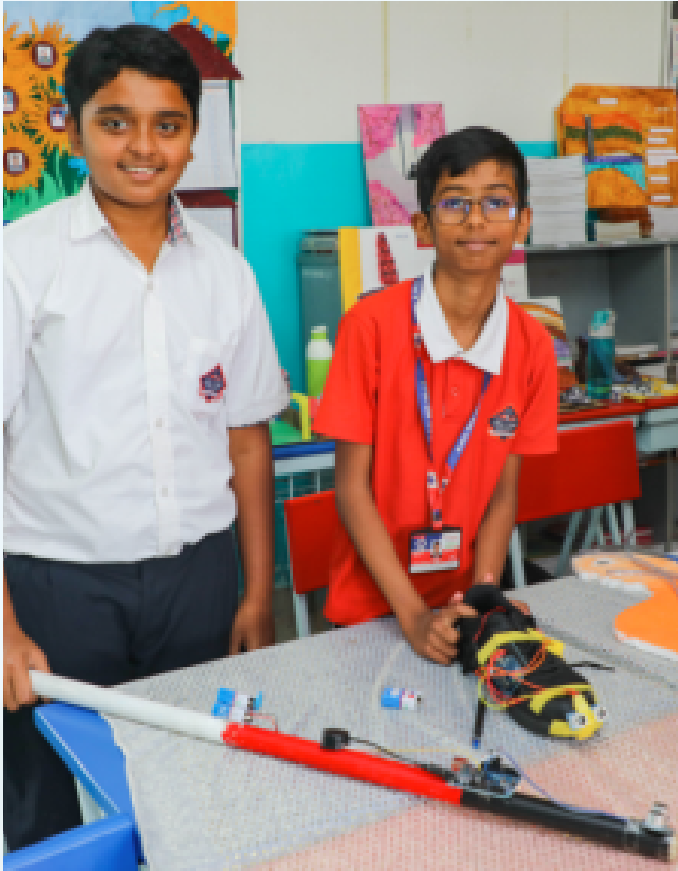

POETRY SLAM COMPETITION

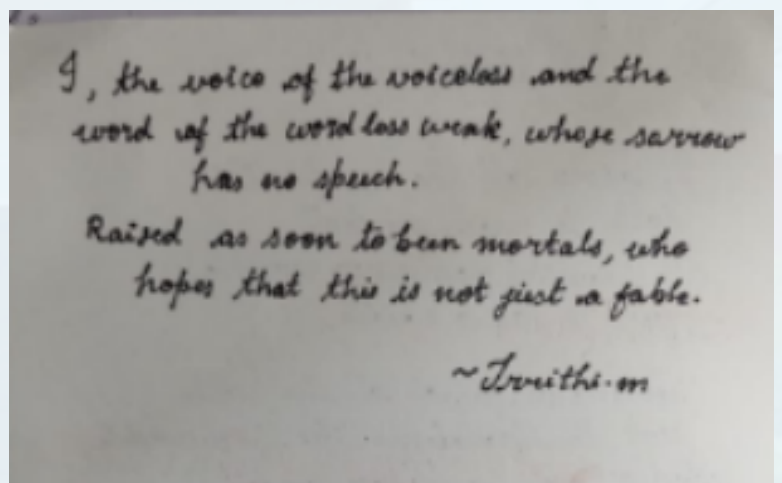
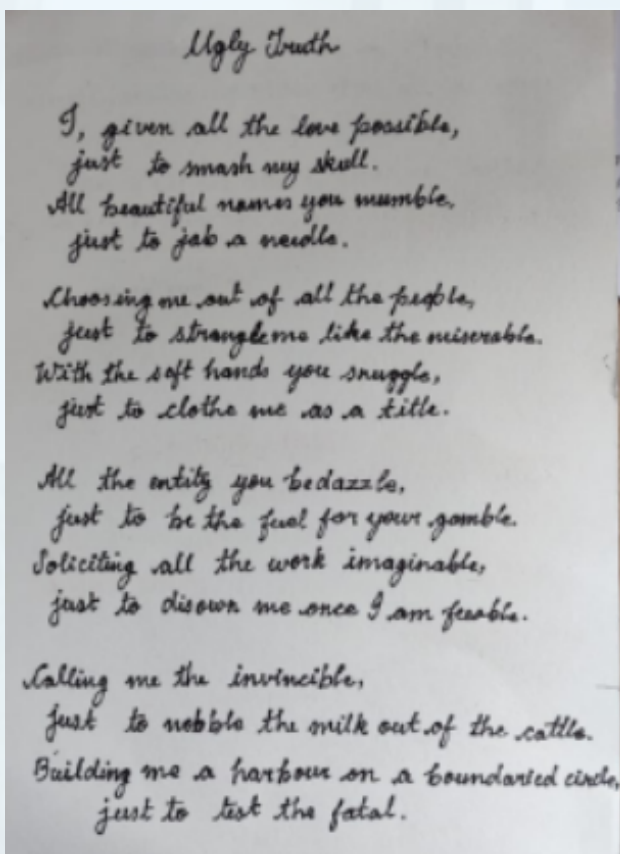
