CHILD ACTIVITY, VIDEO PRESENTATION, OBJECTIVE:


- Students created their own handmade friendship bands using wool.

Maths CCA Activity -Grade 5 - 2D and 3D Geometric Patterns Using Geometrical Shapes



Grade 5 students participated in an exciting activity where they created both 2D and 3D geometric patterns using various shapes. The students explored the fundamentals of geometry by arranging shapes like squares, triangles, and circles to form intricate 2D patterns. In the 3D segment, students took their skills a step further by constructing geometric models using cubes, cones, and pyramids. Senior Secondary & High School (VIII-XII) BAMBOO DRIP IRRIGATION- PROJECT


