Parent Orientation – Building Bridges

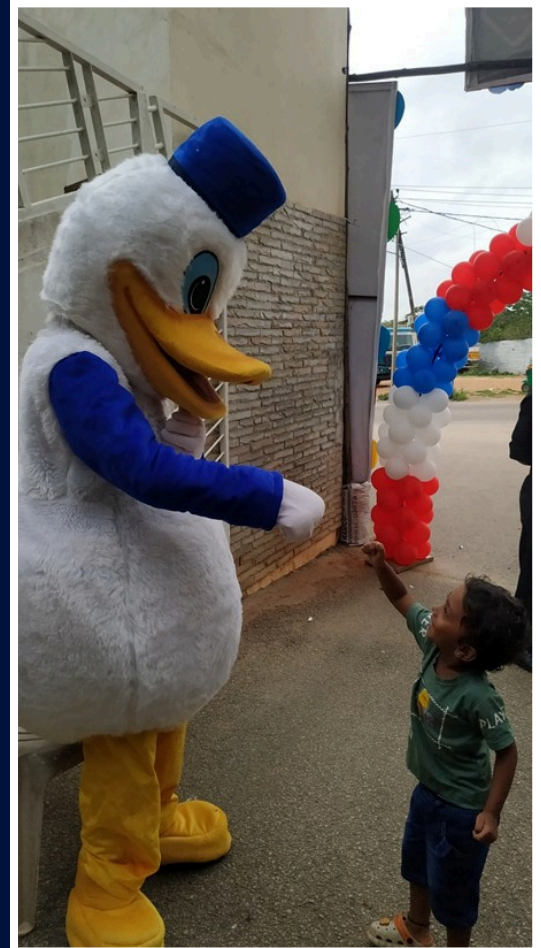

"The environment is where we all meet; where we all have a mutual interest; it is the one thing all of us share." – Lady Bird Johnson

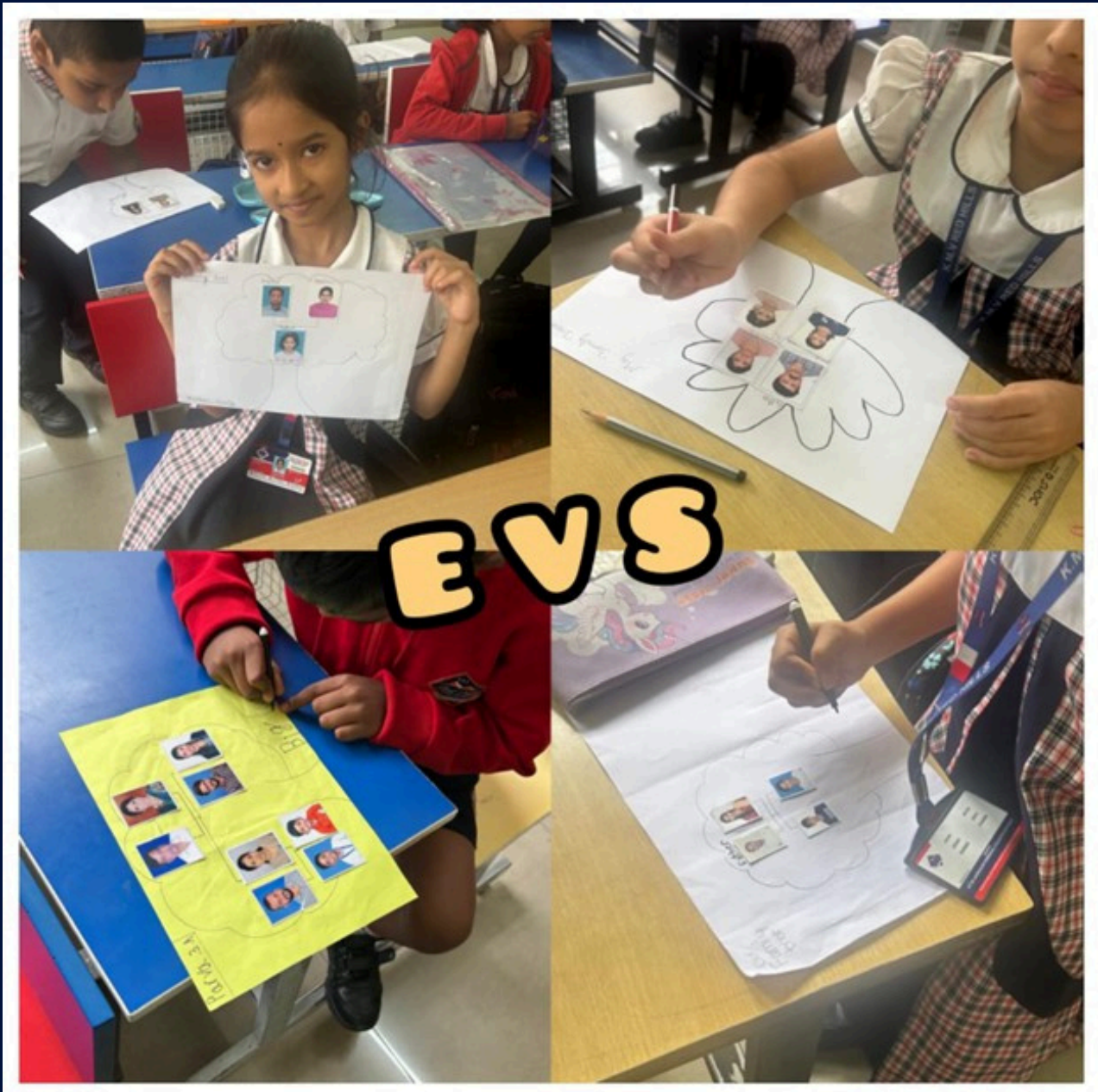

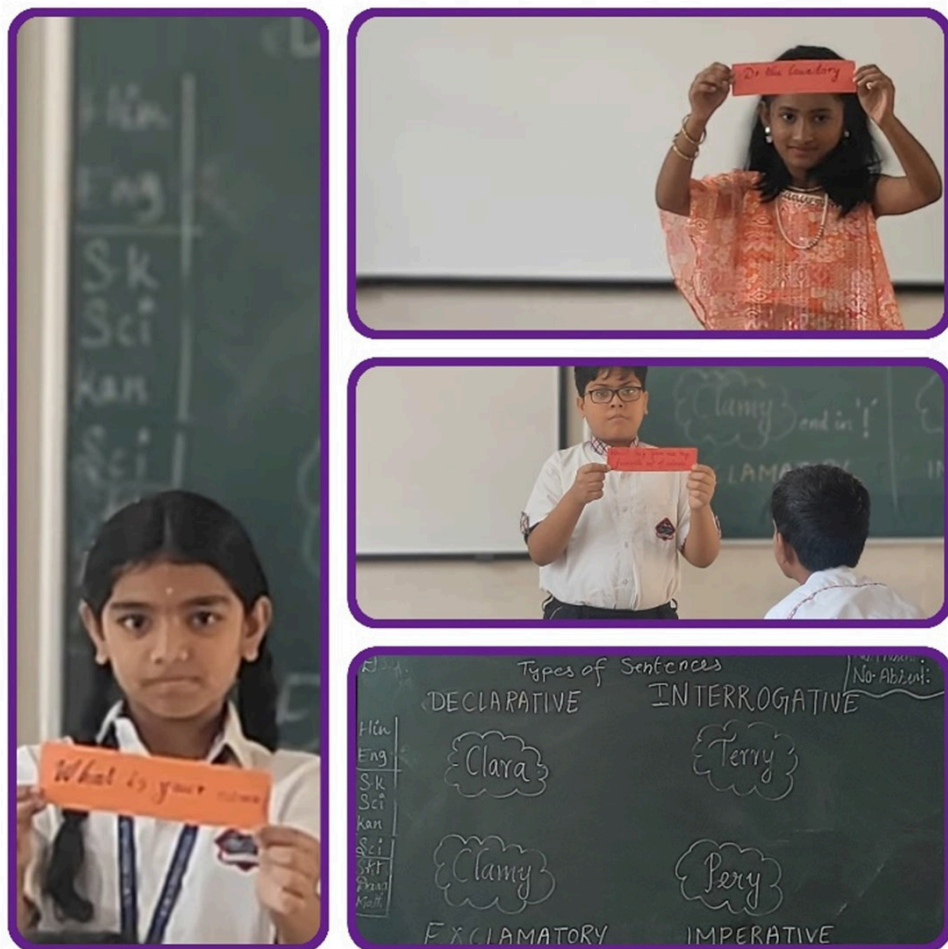

FELICITATION

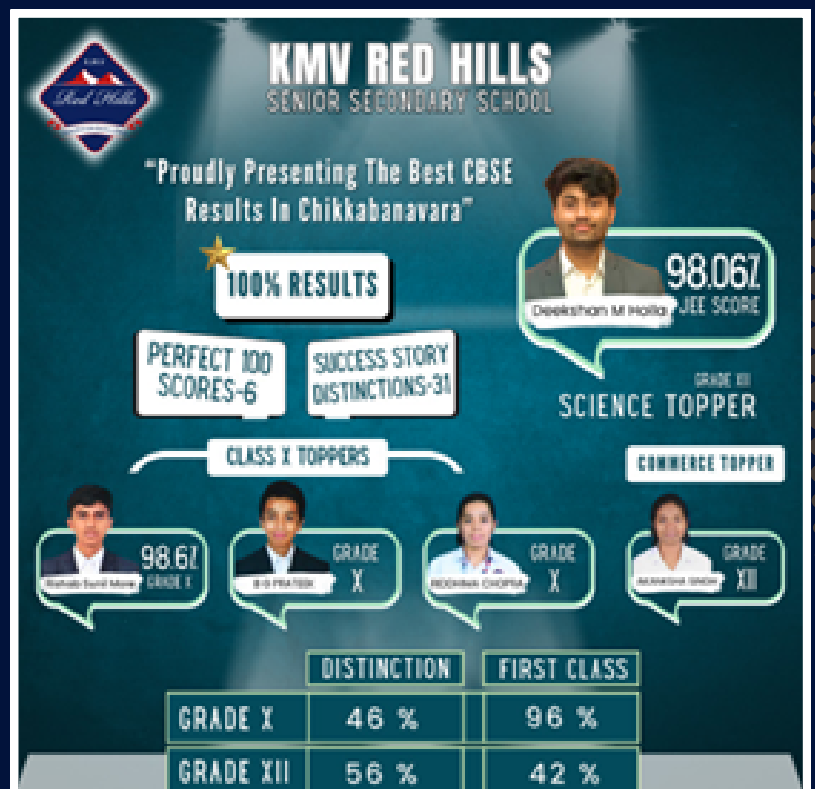

A special mention goes to Rishab Sunil More of Grade 10, who made us all proud by setting a new school record with an exceptional score of 98.6%, the highest in recent years.

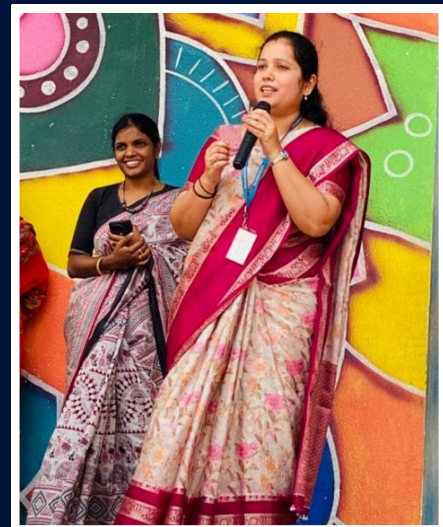

School Conducts First Ever Digital Student Council Election!

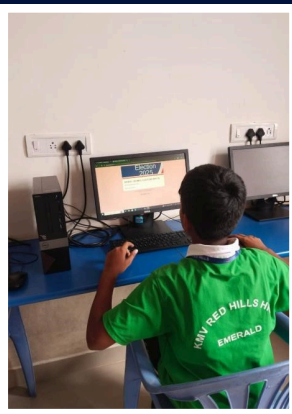
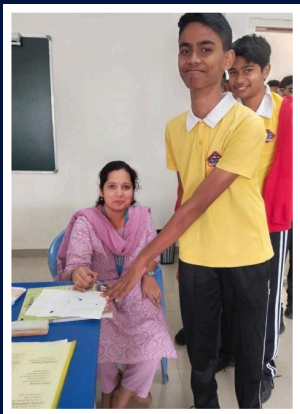
"The future of leadership begins with a single vote — and today, our students voted for tomorrow."
